Dear Friends,

On the 4th February Gainsborough Library will be the venue of our next Circuit Service. Lay Workers, Elizabeth Storey and Debbie Peck, have established a really healthy working relationship with the Library Staff who have welcomed the Methodist Church with open arms. Can I please urge you to come to this Service and be encouraged by this developing relationship which was born of work that Deacon Georgina Brooks began. Together, Elizabeth and Debbie have developed the work. At this service, Library Staff will be thanked for their all-important part in this relationship. John Wesley once famously said, "The whole world is my Parish" and across the Circuit much important work is carried out by a whole host of lay folk and supernumerary ministers.

Methodism is facing an unprecedented challenge, as a short-fall in Minsters means that up to 56 appointments will remain unfilled this coming Connexional year. However, can I assure you that within the Ipswich Circuit the Leadership team are working very hard to address this shortfall. One very positive way forward has been the employment of more lay workers, and by the time you read this a new additional Pastoral Worker will have been appointed to work alongside myself. I urge you all to be very optimistic in your assessment of the Methodist Church and its future development. It is true we face very challenging times, but we are and always have been a grass roots moment. The priesthood of all believers continues to be so much a part of our DNA.

Recently, I have been revisiting the novel "Adam Bede" by George Eliot (pen name of Mary Ann Evans), in which the work of lay Methodist Preacher Dinah Morris plays such a prominent role and vital role. If you have not read this novel, it might inspire you once more to thank God for the work of the laity and our joint calling to share the love of God with all.





If you would like to do something for, or think of, those less fortunate than ourselves during Lent this year, you may like to look at Christian Aid's 'Count your Blessings' scheme, a daily calendar entitled, 'Walk into the wilderness this Lent'.

Christian Aid writes, "As we follow Jesus' journey this Lent, let's confront the wilderness in our own world. Let's walk with our neighbours who have been forced to flee their homes. You'll reflect on the blessings in your life, and you'll see how your support gives people hope."

Each day it gives you a situation that many in the world find themselves in and gives us an opportunity to give thanks for our own riches. It suggests donating small amounts of money to Christian Aid but even if you were unable to do this, the leaflet could act as a useful daily prayer resource for Lent (starting on Ash Wednesday
