Dear Friends

Methodism has always combined a focus on the individual response to God with a passionate and active concern for Social Justice. The Early Methodists were active in the struggle against slavery, campaigned for prison reform and set up a range of educational initiatives to improve literacy and health as well as to develop understanding in the Faith.

In recent times, the Methodist Church has been fully engaged with other Churches and those of other faiths, or none, in challenging injustices in our contemporary world. Examples of these are racism and sexism, human rights abuses, unfair trading practices, unethical investment, environmental pollution and debt counselling services.

Our Christianity is never for ourselves alone. Methodist members are called to care for our own household and church community, but also to go well beyond these bounds in showing God's care for the world.

I am delighted that a good number of people have enrolled to attend the Reimagine Forum on Saturday 7th of October. At this forum we shall be exploring different ways of being Church in the 21st Century (The Reimagine Forum is advertised in the Current Preaching Plan).

In the meantime we thank God for a number of new and developing outreach works across the Circuit.

Many of you will be aware of the two regular Messy Church venues. Gainsborough Library near Landseer Road Methodist and Wadgate Road (A Churches together in Walton project).

After the October half term Kirton Methodist will be the venue for an after school Story Club. Primarily using the Godly Play resources we now have on site. If you are free on Wednesdays between the hours of 3.30pm-5pm you might like to get involved?

At Seaton Road Methodist Church on the 21st of September there is a meeting with John Gillet who is the local Mental Health Parish Nurse. Seaton Road are looking to host a Mental Health drop-in Centre and this will be our first meeting to plan this venture. Do come along if you feel you could help in any way.

Finally, on the October the 21<sup>st</sup>, I will be undertaking a 10k run for CAP, Christians Against Poverty. The funds raised will be going to the development of the ecumenical debt counselling Service to be held at Ranelagh Road Christian Fellowship.

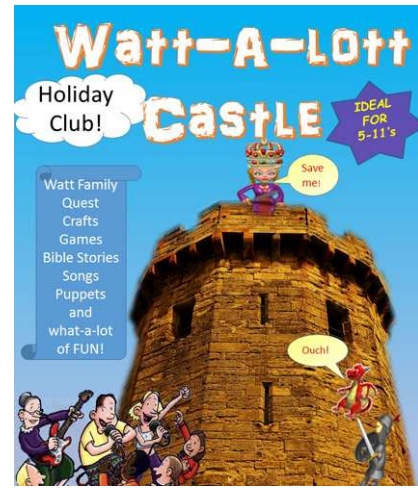

## TRINITY HOLIDAY CLUB

After a highly successful week at Seaton Road Methodist Church, led by Robin and Mary Pattinson, it was now Trinity's turn to stage this year's Holiday Club entitled 'Watt-A-Lott Castle.' This was a week of Christian learning presented in a fun-filled way and what a wonderful time was had by all, children and adults alike.



Sadly our numbers were down on previous years but we couldn't have asked for more well behaved or enthusiastic children.

Through stories taken from the Old Testament, and one from the new, the children learned about not giving up on doing good, courage, loyalty, hope and thankfulness and honour. All characteristics required of the Knights of Old and qualities we strive for, when putting on the Armour of God. Through Bible dramatised narrations, Ratty and Stinky sketches, (Ratty being an aggressive rodent), the Watt Family Drama (probably the most popular and where you were likely to be on the receiving end of Rick's water pistol, alias John Clark), the children learned of Moses' encounters with King Pharaoh, Queen Esther, David and Jonathan, Joshua and Jericho and Jesus, the Servant King.

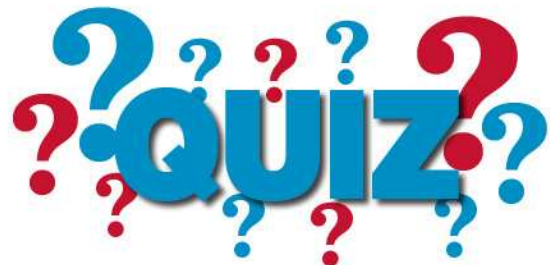

Greetings from Rwanda! We're thrilled that after months of preparation, we have made it here at last! We have spent the last couple of weeks settling in to Gahini, which we expect to now be our home for the next five years. For those reading for whom this is the first of our link letters, Steve is a consultant general surgeon and Catriona is a consultant anaesthetist, both from the UK, and we have come to Eastern Rwanda to work at Gahini Hospital. We aim to provide a surgical and anaesthetic service, develop the hospital's facilities, and train local healthcare staff.
